WHO can complete test corrections?

Anyone! It does not matter what grade your received on the test.

NOTE: If you received a grade **under 75%** you **MUST** do test corrections.

WHAT are test corrections?

Test corrections are a way to earn **half credit** back on any questions that you may have gotten wrong. They must be completed by the **student**.

The following assessments can be corrected:

WHERE do I hand in the test corrections?

You may hand in test corrections in the morning or at the beginning of class to the teacher. You will need to include the **Test Reflection Sheet and Test**.

WHEN are test corrections due?

Test corrections are to be completed **one week** after the test is handed back (but can be turned in before then of course!)

WHY should I do test corrections?

- 1. It is important to LEARN from your mistakes "MISTAKES are PROOF that you are TRYING...
 as long as we FIX them"
- 2. Mathematics BUILDS off of itself. This means that if you don't understand one concept, it can affect your understanding of other concepts. All subject areas are available for test corrections!
- 3. You can improve your test grade!

HOW do I complete test corrections?

- 1. Fill out the <u>Test Reflection Sheet</u>
 - In order to receive credit back on questions, you must COMPLETELY redo the question.
 - This includes showing ALL work (even if you just made a simple adding error).
- 2. Place the **Test Reflection Sheet** in front of the **test**.
- 3. Hand the Test Reflection Sheet and test to your teacher in the morning or at the beginning of the class.
